Worksite Supervisors and Team Leaders Adjustment of the Vocational Education to the Evolution of Company Needs

ConstructyVET is a European project carried out by a transnational strategic partnership built up within the framework of the Erasmus+ programme. It gathers training organisations and research institutes from 8 countries: Belgium (IFAPME), Germany (BZB), France (CCCA-BTP, project leader), Italy (Formedil), Poland (IBE), Portugal (Cenfic), Spain (FLC and FLC Asturias) and United Kingdom (Warrington Collegiate).

The partners aim at reviewing vocational education and training paths intended to worksite supervisors and team leaders in the construction industry.

ConstructyVET in 4 outcomes

Launched in 2015 and scheduled for 3 years, ConstructyVET is focused on four main results:

1. Report on the adequacy between skills needed by building companies concerning team leaders and available training offer.
2. Renewed or new contents for initial and continuing VET addressing team leaders and worksite supervisors.
3. Guidelines for pedagogical methods and tools for (re)designed VET paths addressing both VET centres and company tutors.

4. Model for evaluation and recognition of learning outcomes.

The first experimental phase of the project consisted in the interviews carried out in the partner countries among company representatives to identify current skill needs related to worksite supervisors and team leaders.



Outcomes already available

Two main outcomes, achieved between October 2015 and June 2016, are available:

1. Transnational Analysis of Job Profiles of Worksite Supervisors and Team Leaders currently needed by the construction companies in the partner countries (document in English).
